Survey Data Helps Board Plan Ahead

Every five years the Library Board of Trustees along with the Library Director review and revise the strategic plan. A variety of factors are considered before this plan is developed and shared with the community. It is especially critical now given the Board's commitment to remain at or below the voter approved tax rate. With increased usage (up 23% in June) and declining revenues, the Board and staff must look at realigning priorities.

Over the next several months, the Westmont Public

Library will gather data and information from our residents through written surveys and focus groups. The results will help the Board of Trustee and other community leaders establish new priorities around which a new strategic plan will be developed, one that will serve as a guide for the next five years.

Residents can expect to see surveys in the library at all service desks, on the WPL website, and in the mail for randomly selected households. All Westmont residents are welcome to complete the short

and long form surveys. "We really need to hear from the households that receive the mailed survey this September, as their responses will help to validate the findings of the volunteered responses," said Christine Kuhn, Library Director.

In addition to surveys, several focus groups will meet in the library in order to gain more specific, in-depth information.

Look for a new strategic plan to be rolled out in early 2011!
