



### Did You Know?



### Director's Column

Delivery Service is the backbone of cooperative library services. It stretches the tax dollar by sharing books, DVDs, and other items between libraries. If you visit another library and check something out, you can return it to the Westmont Public Library and we will send it back for you. If you want an item sent to you from another library, you can request it and it is sent to Westmont so that you may check it out.

Without delivery services our patrons will need to do the driving themselves or use a consumer delivery service, such as the US Postal Service, to return items to distant

libraries. The current cost of the in-state service is less than 30 cents per item. In the last 9 months Westmont patrons received more than 20,000 items from other libraries, and State funding paid for it. Next year the cost will most likely come from local dollars, either by reducing programs and services elsewhere in the budget, or passing the cost along to the requesting patron.

In October, all Regional Library Systems in Illinois received a portion of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2010 funding, which will support SWAN and delivery service solidly through January 2011, and possibly longer depending on future payments. All other System services and staff have been cut or spun off into memberfunded entities.

Library systems are still owed \$3.7 million from the State of Illinois for FY2010 (July 2009-June 2010). The Illinois State Library has advised all systems to plan for the probability that the entire balance of the FY2010 funding may not arrive by December 31, 2010. Systems have not received any state funds for FY2011 (July 2010-June 2011) and may not receive payments in the future. (Written in part by Su Bochenski, MLS Director)
