device as well as in your web browser with Kindle Cloud Reader. You can expect to see the same features in your borrowed library eBook as Kindle books, including Whispersync technology real page numbers, and more.

The best part about reading a library eBook on your Kindle? There are no

overdue fees! Your library eBook will automatically be returned to our digital collection on its due date.

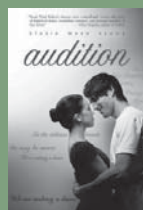

The repair of our front entrance plaza gave us an opportunity to break up the former sea of concrete and bring more green closer to the building.

The delightful garden of basil, marigolds, yarrow and coleuses was the work and gift of our facility project manager, David

Clark. The coleuses have been lifted to weather the winter months inside. The very successful basil and marigolds will make an appearance next year through the harvested seeds. The yarrow is a very successful Midwest perennial.
