

THE LIBRARY YEAR IN REVIEW

Every year, public libraries in Illinois collect and report data to the Secretary of State to provide a snapshot of the services and programs we provide. Some highlights for the Westmont Public Library from May 2015 to April 2016 include:

- We were open 351 days out of the year.
- We offered more than 500 programs, and had 11,122 people attend those programs.
- Patrons checked out 321,408 items.
- We had 203,995 people walk through our doors.


