



Richmond **EDUCATION GARDENS &** APIARY

An outdoor classroom and green space developed by the communities of Clarendon Hills and Westmont

The Gardens will include a hobbyist apiary, and an array of native gardens including butterfly, vegetable, wildflowers, wall, and rain. Once complete, the Gardens will provide a new space in our communities to provide educational programs about natural and organic gardening methods and our environment.

In 2018, a rough grade of the site was completed, brush was cleared by ComEd, a cistern donated by DuPage Water Commission was installed by Clarendon Hills (the cistern will hold storm water, which will then be used to irrigate the property), and the Village of Westmont held a fundraiser to raffle off a painted water barrel.

For 2019, plans include the installation of pervious concrete by the Village of Westmont, installation of bricks and memorial bricks, and the installation of a rain garden, which will be part of an Eagle Scout project.
