HOW IT WORKS

Kids (babies-5th grade): Pick up a log sheet at the library to help keep track of time spent reading! For every 15 minutes you read, cross off a dinosaur head. Finish a section and you get a prize! After finishing all three sections of the map, you will have completed the program! Continuing log sheets will be available for kids who read above and beyond the required amount.



Teens (6th-12th grade): There are some awesome grand prizes for our teen readers this year (see below)! Go online every day that you spend more than 30 minutes reading, and enter your name in a drawing for the grand prizes. The more days you read, the more entries you get!

Adults: Like the teens, adult readers can go online and enter their name into a drawing for one of the grand prizes for every day that they read longer than 30 minutes. Go ahead- read a newspaper, a magazine, an online article, or whatever else you are interested in! Paper entry forms will be available in the library for anyone who prefers that method.



DIRECTOR'S COLUMN

Last week the library was visited by several 1st and 2nd grade classes. The children were asked if Westmont Public Library owned every book in the world. They all responded YES! Unfortunately, that is not true. Like everyone else, we must make informed choices on how we spend money.

When ordering hot new titles, we look at the number of holds patrons have placed to determine how many copies to order. We post forthcoming title lists to peak your interest and hopefully inspire holds. When we receive donated new titles (less than six months old) often we will add them to the collection.

Additionally, we rely on experience, statistics, and knowledge about community interests. When an author releases a new book, we look at how often her or his earlier books were checked out. If it is a new author, we rely on reviews that hopefully give us enough information to know if there is an audience for the book/CD/DVD here in Westmont. If we know cook books and auto repair books are checked out frequently we will buy more. If an area of the collection is barely used, say religion or literature, then we tend not to add too much to those areas.

However, I do hear people say we don't have what they want or need, because it is always checked out, or we don't own it, or they visit neighboring libraries that have bigger collections. This is where communication is important. In addition to the patron holds which tell us what to buy or buy more of, we also have a suggestion form on our website and at the Main Desk. We do take Westmont patron suggestions very seriously, especially when they are accompanied by a contact name, library card number, and a phone number or email.

It is our goal to have what Westmont residents need or want to read, listen to, or view. Help us help you. Place a hold!
