If you prefer to keep track on paper, you can also pick up a reading log at the Library!
- 2 You can log in with an existing Beanstack account, if you have one, or create a new account. To add other family members to your account, simply **Add a Reader**.
- 3 **Record your reading** in Beanstack or on your paper log.
For Read to Me and Adult challenges, log each book you read. Grade School and Teen readers track by minutes.
